Scrap metal dealers are required to make payment by mailing a check or money order for all scrap metal transactions that exceed \$25 (previously \$300). Scrap metal buyers cannot participate in more than one cash transaction for scrap metal per seller per day.

##### H2208: AGRICULTURE; REGULATED ACTIVITIES [Neutral]

The list of duties of the Dept of Environmental Quality (DEQ) is expanded to include developing dust forecasts for the Maricopa County PM-10 nonattainment area. The forecasts shall be for five-day periods and shall be posted daily on the department's website. As soon as practicable after a day

is forecast to be at high risk of dust generation, the director of DEQ must issue a dust action general permit to reduce dust pollution from regulated agricultural activities. A dust action general permit may be required for a person who conducts a dust-generating operation who has failed to implement an appropriate best practice. A person who has a permit issued relative to control of fugitive dust must not be required to obtain a dust action general permit, but the person still must implement required dust control measures on days forecast to be at high risk of dust generation. The Best Management Practices Committee for Regulated Agricultural Activities may adopt revisions to its rules regarding small-size particulate pollution (PM-10) without going through the otherwise required formal rule-making review process. The rule changes go into effect immediately but must be published in the state's Administrative Register. Session law only; does not affect statutes. AS SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.

The Attorney General shall file eminent domain actions on property possessed by the federal government that facilitate the state's ability to manage or provide access to or increase the profitability of state trust land or property for a public use that increases the ability of the state to generate revenue. Exceptions for land held by the federal government for a reclamation project, on which permanent improvements have been constructed or that is legally encumbered. AS PASSED HOUSE.

permitted by law to allow the regulated person to correct, the agency must provide a written explanation of why the opportunity to correct was not allowed; evidence of serious violations gathered improperly by a regulator that previously could not be excluded from being used as evidence in a civil or administrative proceeding is now admissible only at the discretion of the trier of fact. A separate, legal class of person is created who has leased state trust land for at least 10 years. If the person fails to comply with a condition of the lease (e.g., nonpayment of rent) that would otherwise result in a default status being declared, the state land commissioner is authorized to extend the time for payment of the delinquent amount for up to five years. The city would have been required to adopt written statements of work for each service for which bids would have been sought. All documents and communications related to competitive bidding would have been public records. Any taxpayer in the city would have had standing to bring special action to enforce compliance. Her veto message stated the bill is riddled with shortcomings, including the omission of necessary definitions and the parameters by which anticipated costs are to be determined.
